When my husband and I took on the responsibility of matching sponsors with students in 2017, I had no idea the amount of joy it would bring to us. Twice a year we would receive photographs and letters and cards to organize and distribute to you, the children's sponsors. It was through pictures and letters that we became familiar with the names and faces of the children you were and are blessing with education, food, medical treatment and most importantly, your love and prayers. We were able to watch them grow just through correspondence. In December of 2018, I had the privilege of visiting the campus for the first time. I saw so many familiar faces and received so many hugs. The blessings continued as I met the parents. They were working throughout the school cooking, cleaning and doing everything they could to support the mission of educating their children. As much as I enjoyed meeting the children with all the hugs and smiles, it was the parents that made the biggest

impact on me. I work in the school system here in the U.S., and the biggest problem we face is often lack of parental support. This was not an issue in Nicaragua. I was hearing all kinds of stories from parents about how much they appreciate what you are doing to change the lives of their children. They were sharing with me the struggles that they were having without education and the amazing opportunity that you provide for their children to not only gain that education, but to also have the great support system that the school offers. I was so fortunate to sit with Sandra and hear some stories of how things were going at the school during the protests. Our children were in a crisis situation, and the family at Nicaragua Christian School took it as an opportunity to serve the children at the school. They also showed the love of Christ to the families in the neighborhood near the school. This is what mission work looks like. This is what Jesus would be doing in this community. I truly believe that the money you send to support this work is going to further the Lord's kingdom in Nicaragua.
