It's been 8 months since we returned to Tennessee after living in Nicaragua for two years. Our first visit to Nicaragua was in November of 2009. By March of 2010, we felt that Nicaragua









Christian School was where God wanted us to be. After talking to the president of the school board and our church elders, we made a commitment to serve two years in Nicaragua. Neither my husband nor I had any training in missions, but we knew that God had called us. So, in January 2011 we moved to Nicaragua. We lived in a house on the campus of Nicaragua Christian School and worked with the school and the six preachers supported by Campbell St. Church of Christ. Moving to Nicaragua was a huge adjustment for our family. Our daughter, who was 12 years old at the time, cried every day for three months. We wondered if we had made the right decision or if our kids would be in therapy for the rest of their lives because we took them away from their home and moved them to a third world country. God assured us over and over again that we were right where he wanted us.

In some ways, it seems like a lifetime ago that we lived in Nicaragua. At times, it seems like we were never there. We are back in our home in Jackson, attending the same church, chauffeuring the kids to different activities and doing the same type of work we did before Nicaragua.

When I was in Nicaragua, I longed for America and now that I'm in America I long for Nicaragua. I miss the simple life in Nicaragua. I miss the people of Nicaragua. I miss hearing worship songs sung in Spanish. I miss seeing all the students at NCS play at recess. I miss working with mission teams. I miss our American missionary friends that continue to live and serve in Nicaragua. I miss being in Nicaragua. I will always have a special place in my heart for Nicaragua. Academic Competition Success

Each year, Nicaragua holds an academic competition for students in grades 6-11. There are 600 schools in Leon and the surrounding area that participate in this competition. This was the first year that NCS was able to compete. Two students, Leonidas and Leticia, represented NCS. Leonidas competed in mathematics and Leticia competed in Spanish. Leticia took 2nd place out of 50 schools. Leonidas continued to take 1st place in math at each competition. He won 1st place out of 600 hundred On August 8th, Leonidas competed in the schools! National finals in Managua. He performed admirably even though he did not place in the competition. We are proud of Leonidas, Leticia and the teachers that helped them prepare for this competition.

August 10, 2013 a parade was held in Leon to recognize the achievements of the students in Leon who participated in this competition. NCS was asked to lead the parade. Leonidas carried the national flag and Leticia carried the school flag. We are thankful for the ways that God continues to bless NCS.
