There were about 500 in attendance for the evening that also included the introduction of the Parent's Board (like a PTA) and some special gifts to the cleaning ladies by that board for all their work. There were class parties and the official close of classes on Wednesday, November 29 with a school wide goodbye as each student, beginning with the graduating high school class, walked by in file and each greeted and hugged everyone else.
