# God Is At Work In Nicaragua

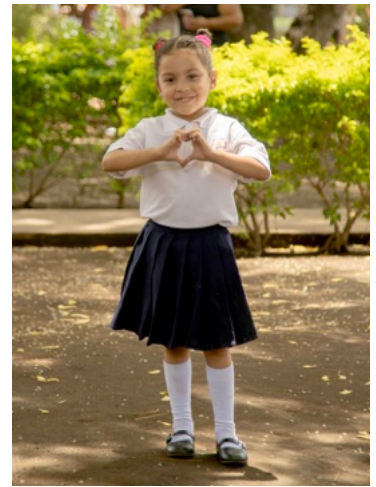
